## FAQ: Proxy Voting

- ★ What is Proxy Voting?
  - If a member is unable to attend a congregational meeting in person, they may appoint someone to vote for them by proxy. Be sure to discuss your position on issues with your proxy so they can vote as you most likely would if you were present.
- ★ Who can be my Proxy?
  - Any other member is eligible to carry a proxy vote, so long as they are not already carrying a proxy vote. Please reach out to <u>board@uucnh.org</u> if you need help securing a member to carry your proxy.
- ★ How many Proxies can one member carry?
  - Only one.
- ★ Do proxies count towards establishing a quorum?
  - No, so please make every effort to attend congregational meetings in person.
- ★ I really can't attend in person, where can I get a proxy form?
  - Proxy forms are available to download by clicking on the button on the UUCNH's homepage here: <u>https://uucnh.org/</u> Paper copies are available on the welcome desk in the Church entrance or by using the link in the e news.
- ★ Can we use a proxy form from a previous meeting?
  - No, you must sign the new form for the meeting you are missing.
- ★ Can the proxy carrier bring the signed and completed form to the meeting and turn it in when they register? Or does it have to be turned in further in advance?
  - Signed proxy forms must be received by a Board Member prior to the start of the meeting. The forms can be turned in by your proxy upon checking in at the registration table. If you prefer to turn them in early, you may submit them to the church office or email scanned signed forms to <u>Board@uucnh.org</u>.
